Welcome to the first Newsletter of 1982, a year in which we all hope that Kim will continue to broaden her achievements. In terms of chart action, the first couple of months of the year have been quiet for Kim to say the least, but January and February are notoriously slack times for record releases as the pre-Christmas rush is inclined to exhaust record dealers and buyers alike.

January saw Cambodia slip out of the British Chart having attained the number 12 position. On the Continent, however, the single is still going strong and has reached number 2 in the German Chart and 1 in Sweden. In actual fact, total sales of Cambodia are rapidly approaching the figure achieved by Kids In America, so what appears on the face of it to have been a moderate seller is proving to be quite a success.

During January, Kim had her first holiday since before the release of Kids In America — spending a week ski-ing in the Pyrenees. Kim had a great time and managed to spend a relatively inconspicuous but nonetheless hectic week. A lot of fans have asked whether Kim is interested in sport, and although she does have a reasonable knowledge of some of the major sporting events that occur from month to month, ski-ing is probably the only sport that she gets actively involved in — albeit only once a year. Her love of ski-ing extends back almost ten years to her first ski-ing holiday with her school and she has been a number of times since then.

I'm sure that Kim would like me to mention the fact that she has recently received a bicycle for Christmas though, and also that she possesses a pair of jogging shoes, so her desire to remain fit may well succeed.

Upon her return from holiday, Kim spent a couple of weeks in the studio to continue work on the new album. At the time of going to print there is no release date for the album but it is expected to be towards the end of March. After the studio, Kim spent a much publicised week in America, where she is yet to have had a record released.

Contrary to the popular belief nothing has yet been signed with respect to America, but we will of course keep you up to date with events across the Atlantic although as yet there is nothing more to report.

Since returning from America, work on the album has been held up slightly for Kim to work on a Japanese television commercial. As you may have read in the newspapers, both Kim and Ricky have been working closely with a Japanese musician called Masami who fronts a band known as Ippu-do, who are receiving quite a lot of British Press coverage at the moment. The band are very successful in Japan and are currently trying to establish an audience in the UK. Their cause was helped by a play on Radio One's Round Table when everyone present was impressed. The jingle was written by Masami and Ricky produced it with Kim supplying the vocals. The song may be released as a single in Japan but it will not be available in this country.


