Its quickly come around again to that time when the bumper Kim Wilde Fan Club Newsletter drops quietly through your letterbox, just begging to be read and enjoyed.

I trust that you all had a good Holiday and that the Easter Bunny did his stuff.

This is number 4, and once again it offers you info, photos, a competition and much, much more. I would suspect that by now you have all heard Kim's new single, 'View From a Bridge' which, like all her others to date, was written by Marty and Ricki. The single was officially released on April 5 and helped quite considerably by nearly 50,000 advance orders, charted at 44 the following week. At the time of writing, the single has moved up to occupy the number 30 position and Kim has just recorded Top of the Pops. By the time you receive this letter the single will hopefully have moved further up the charts and TOTP will have been transmitted, but within these very pages you will read more about that day at TOTP to give you a better idea of exactly what a TV show such as this entails.

Talking of TV shows, Kim has just returned from Germany and Switzerland where she made TV appearances to coincide with the single release abroad and is also due to visit Germany again and France within the next week.

After France, Kim is likely to visit Japan and also America where the first album has just been released. Initial reaction to the record has been good across the Atlantic where it appears on the Liberty Label, but as yet there has been no single release in the U.S.

As mentioned in the last Newsletter the single in Japan is going to be an extended version of a Japanese TV ad which Kim appears in and the song is called 'Bitter is Better'. Unfortunately, if you want a copy of this track you will have to hop on a plane as there are no plans to release it in this Country.

Kim's second album has now been completed, barring a few finishing touches, and is due to be released on May 10. The catalogue number is SRAK 548 and the album is called 'Select'. It features both 'Cambodia' and the current hit single as well as many more new tracks. Everyone is thrilled with the final result so all that remains to be seen is whether you all like it - I'm sure you will.

The next thing on the agenda is obviously Kim's tour which is being planned as I write. It would probably surprise you to learn just how many people are involved in setting up a tour for a major Artiste, apart from the musicians themselves. The promoter is responsible for piecing together the engagements taking care to ensure that the show does not have to play Glasgow one night and Cornwall the next. He is also responsible for all advertising, ticket distribution and venue choice which is obviously subject to availability. In addition to this, the record Company play an important part as do the management. On a creative level, the sound has to be handled by a real professional who must know the set inside-out. The sound in each venue is initially different due to size, shape and even the material the walls are made of. These factors all play an important part and have to be weighed off against each other to achieve the perfect sound on each night. A sound engineer is responsible for the proper functioning of the various pieces of equipment and must be permanently on call. There has to be a team of people who are responsible for the people employed on the tour and they have to make sure that everyone has somewhere to sleep at nights and knows where to go the following day and, of course, how to get there. Last, but by no means least, come the roadies who spend all their time lugging heavy and expensive pieces of equipment from lorry to stage and stage to lorry.

As you can see, therefore, the behind the scene crew are almost as important and the whole process has to be expertly co-ordinated if the show is to be a success.

At the moment a few dates are being discussed but we have nothing concrete to offer you with regards places etc., but hopefully by the time the next Newsletter is printed we shall have much more news.

Over the Easter weekend, Kim attended a couple of charity functions which were held in London. On Good Friday she popped along to the Bloomsbury-Collegiate Theatre in Euston to lend her assistance to the flagging Music-Biz team in the Marathon Music Quiz which was broadcast by Radio One at various times during the holiday. Those of you who heard the event will know that it was a music quiz between the Business and a Radio One Team comprising Disc Jockeys and Producers which lasted from 10.00am on Good Friday to 6.25pm on Easter Saturday — without a break. The quizmaster was Mike Reid and the team captains were Martin Rushent (record producer and impresario) for the music business, and Paul Gambaccini for Radio One. These three people were present all the time and were joined by other team members at regular intervals.

As well as competing in the quiz, Kim also took along a signed copy of the 'Cambodia' video and assorted singles and albums, also autographed, and these were offered for auction. All the money raised was donated to the Nordoff-Robbins Music Therapy Centre for the treatment of handicapped people — a very worthy cause I'm sure you'll agree.



On Easter Saturday, Kim paid a visit to the quiz and also visited Capital Radio where they were holding the now familiar 'Help a London Child' campaign. Kim was interviewed live on Capital, signed lots of autographs and donated signed singles and a signed Gold Disc from France to help raise money for what is, again, a very good cause.

Unfortunately, after leaving Capital, Kim visited a restaurant in London and at some stage during the evening her handbag was stolen. The bag was found 4 days later in Regents Park minus some cash, cheque book and credit card. Thankfully, however, Kim's Passport had not been removed which is just as well as it is probably her most frequently used possession at the moment.

TOTP - A Day in the Life

TOTP is undoubtedly the most important music programme in the Country and with a weekly audience approaching 15 million can often determine the success or otherwise of a new record. Kim learns on the Tuesday of the week of broadcast, whether she is to be on TOTP and, as you can imagine, is always delighted when the all-important telephone call comes through.

On this occasion we sent someone from the Fan Club to sample the atmosphere and pick up a story — sounds like a football commentary doesn't it?

Top of the Pops is recorded at the BBC Studios in Wood Lane, London. The BBC building is

enormous and houses many studios as well as offices for other BBC staff. Kim arrived at 11.15am and was shown to a dressing room which became hers for the day. Kim just had time to gulp a cup of coffee before she was called to the studio for the first time. When we entered the studio I was amazed at how large it was. The ceiling was covered with lights of all description projecting beams at every inch of the floor which was littered with cameras, camera stands, cables and technicians — all of whom have a particular task for the day. The next half hour or so was spent working out stage formations and a few preliminary camera angles, after

which Kim had time to grab some lunch and chat with some of the other artists also appearing. On this occasion these included Pigbag, PhD, Elton John (what a star) and others.

As there are always so many so many people appearing on TOTP the show does take a full day to prepare but each artist is obviously not busy all the time. Having said this it is most surprising just how tiring it can be to sit around and wait for your call as I myself soon discovered. The one thing that struck me was the amount of work that has to be put in before the show can be recorded. There is always something going on right throughout the day, be it working on sets or special effects, lighting or camerawork.

When Kim is actually on stage, her performance is pieced together bit by bit so that the cameramen, director, producer and editor know which shot and which angle should be used for best effect and at the end of the day there is only time for one run through before the audience are brought in and the show is recorded. As I learnt later, it is after this that the Editor's work really begins as he combines yards and yards of film on each artist to prepare the best combination of shots.

The actual recording of the show finished at 9.00pm by which time I was certainly ready for bed – you'll never catch me saying that pop stars have it easy.



Hi,


I hope you're all keeping well, and that those of you who've got school exams coming up shortly aren't getting too worried about them.


