

I would like to take this opportunity to apologise for the lateness of the last Fan Club Newsletter. Most of you would have received the magazine three or four weeks later than scheduled and this delay was due to several problems. Initially we had a certain amount of difficulty getting hold of Kim for long enough to pass on her letter, etc. and give us the go ahead on the news items. A second problem arose when we had to wait for several important pieces of information and finally it was delayed at the printers – it's not all plain sailing you know....

Anyway, we're back to normal with this issue and Kim has even found time to write out some more lyrics which can be found further on in the Newsletter.

There is another matter which has to be raised at this stage and is regarding the renewal of membership. As you know the membership expires after the next issue of the Newsletter, i.e. at the end of August. At this time, the Fan Club will have been in operation for exactly one year and we will all have a fairly good idea of how successful it's been. As I'm sure you appreciate, the Fan Club demands a great deal of time and effort, alot of which is spent simply opening mail and as such now requires a sizeable team of part-time helpers. Up until now, these people have not been paid but have done it for fun which is just as well as the Fan Club could not have afforded it. During the year, the Fan Club has lost a certain amount of money due to rising costs, increases in postage rates and a desire to keep up the quality of material and merchandise. If we are to continue it will be necessary to employ one full-time member of staff whose wages will have to be paid out of the subscription fee. For these reasons we may have to cease the Fan Club unless we can be sure that a lot of the current membership will rejoin. If a second year proves to be possible, we will have to reduce the Newsletters to four issues a year - at three monthly intervals - and increase the membership fee to £3.50. Each Newsletter will contain as much information – probably more – and in place of the initial membership package, members will receive a rejoin package. Membership for overseas fans will be increased to £6.00.

Throughout the year the Fan Club has proved to be an enjoyable project for Kim and the people around her and we would all naturally love to keep it running but it is up to you.

What we would like you to do is fill in the form on the back of this issue and send it back to us and this will give us some indication as to how many of you are considering rejoining at which stage we will know whether or not we can carry on. I must stress that if you say you would like to rejoin, you are by no means committed and are perfectly entitled to change your mind at a later date - it's just a way for us to get some idea.

While we are dealing with important issues, I would like to remind you that when you are sending in money for T-Shirts or Badges, you must also include your name, address and membership number as many of you are forgetting and this makes it impossible to send the goods off until you send a letter of complaint. Thanks.

It now looks likely that Kim will be touring the UK in mid-September through to the first week in October. At the moment we have an 18 date tour pencilled in but unfortunately we cannot confirm any of the dates or venues at this stage, suffice as to say they wll hold between two and three and a half thousand people so everyone has a good chance of seeing Kim perform live. I would suggest that you keep an eye on tour announcements in the music press over the next month or so, but we will certainly give you full details in the next Newsletter.

I know for a fact that Kim is getting very itchy feet and cannot wait to get on stage and from what I can gather it is going to be a very spectacular show indeed.

I would imagine (or hope) that most of you have bought Kim's new LP, 'Select' by now, I hope you like it. The reaction from some of your letters has been excellent. The chart position for the album in the UK has been a little disappointing so far. After entering at 25, it moved up to 19 in the second week and then dropped three places to 22 in the third. This particular week it is 33 but it has been considerably more successful elsewhere – mind you it has gone silver (60,000 copies) in the UK. At the time of writing it is 2 in Switzerland, 2 in Sweden (having already been No. 1), 6 in Germany, 6 in Holland (again after being No. 1) and 1 in Belgium. 'View From a Bridge' is climbing the charts in Australia, Belgium, Denmark, Germany, Sweden, Norway and Switzerland.

It looks as if the next single will not be a track off the album but will be a completely new song. Kim is currently in the studio putting down some vocals and although we dont have a title or release date at the moment, I would imagine that it will be in the shops in five or six weeks.

We thought you might be interested in what Kim's brother, Ricky, has been doing since the album was completed. As you know, Ricky is Kim's record producer and he is beginning to be in great demand in that capacity. He has been approached by a number of other bands to do production and has recently finished his first alternative project by producing and co-arranging a solo single by Mick Karn, the Bass player with Japan. For those of you who are interested, the single is called 'Sensitive' and is released on June 25th – so keep a listen out for it.



Letter from Kim

Hi,

Well I've just got back from New York and Japan. New York – I spent 4 days doing radio interviews and press. One magazine was called Trouser Press which I think you can get over here, so keep an eye out. Unfortunately I had my camera stolen before I went so I couldn't take any photos of New York. One evening I was taken to see a Broadway Show with Lauren Bacall (the one who used to be married to Humphrey Bogart). She was incredible and still looks great. On the day we had free, Sonja (a girl from my record Company) and I took a boat over to see the Statue of Liberty. When we told the people at EMI America – all of whom were New Yorkers – none of them had ever been there!! It was huge and impressive and a very long climb to the top. We would have made the climb but there were too many people. While I was there 'Kids in America' picked up some very important plays on influential Radio Stations some of which I visited. I think they liked me. Meanwhile both 'Kids in America' and my first album have charted over there but it will be some weeks before we know if we've cracked it or not. Fingers crossed.

From there to Japan – Fifteen long hours on a plane, well at least I had my Walkerman, a real life saver, and my first taste of traditional Japanese food – great stuff. I was staying in Tokyo and did a press conference where 200 people turned up. It was incredible. A lot of hard work trying to communicate with people who mostly didn't speak English, but they were charming and I made many friends there. I stayed in Japan 15 days. On the day we had off we visited a place in Tokyo called Harguko. It was a Sunday and all the Rockabillys turn up to Rock'n'Roll in the streets. Literally hundreds of people dressed up to the nines in traditional Rock'n'Roll costumes. Every classic Rock'n'Roll tune can be heard. The funny thing is, a lot of the kids have to change their clothes before they get home otherwise their families disown them. You sometimes think you've got it bad here, but over there no-one leaves home until they get married, and all the girls are trained for marriage. By the time I left Japan I was very sad to go. I'll look forward to going back.

When I got back, my album had gone straight in at 25 – thanks to everyone for buying it. We'll shortly be bringing out a new single and rehearsing for a UK Tour – Yes, I promise you'll get one very soon.

Lastly, I'd personally like to thank Kathryn Searle for giving our Fan Club such a great plug on 'Freetime', everyone at the Fan Club were knocked out. So until the next time, take care and lots of love,

Kim brought back a few photos from Japan, all of which were taken at the press reception she mentioned, so we thought you might like to see a couple of them.

One thing that Kim neglected to mention was the fact that her single in Japan which is called 'Bitter is Better', is currently in the Top 10 of one of the Japanese charts. In Japan there is one chart which contains home-grown stars and another for foreign – mainly English – acts, and this is the one that Kim is doing very well in.





We have recently had more good news from America where, as previously mentioned, 'Kids in America' and the first album have both just been released. In American the charts are compiled in a slightly different way to the UK. The simple reason for this is that the country is so huge and there are so many records released each week that it would be virtually impossible to compile a total 'sales' chart. Generally speaking, although they do have a Top 100 singles chart and a top 200 album chart, only those records in the top 30 or 40 are actually placed in order of sales and those outside are arranged depending on the amount of Airplay they are getting. There are so many independant commercial Radio Stations in the States that you have to be liked by a good percentage for your record to begin to sell, otherwise people in a particular part of the Country may never even hear your songs. As you can imagine, therefore, it is very difficult for a new artist to be successful in America but two or three from the UK such as The Human League, Haircut 100 and Soft Cell are beginning to make an impact over there along with Kim. The good news I mentioned is that Kids in America has just moved up to 47 in the Billboard Top 100 and the album is just outside the 100. The next two or three weeks will determine whether 'Kids' is going to be a hit and we will, of course, keep you informed.

Kim has written out the lyrics to two tracks from the new album so that you can sing along to them in the privacy of your own homes. The tracks are 'Ego' and 'Words Fell Down'.


Kim's Top Twelve


