


As some of you are aware, Kim appeared in a 'Rock Against Racism' concert which was held on the 7th December at 'Le Bourget', about 20 Kilometres north of Paris. Kim was the headline act at the concert, which also featured 14 other bands.

On the morning of Friday the 6th December, Joyce, Nick, Mandy, Rick, Pete and myself left at about 7.30. We travelled in the Company Caravanette, while Kim, the Band and Crew left London in the Touring Coach. After arriving in Calais I spent the majority of the Journey on the coach, and never having been on a Touring Coach before, I must say I was pleasantly surprised and found it extremely comfortable.

We booked into the hotel soon after 9.00pm and after some food we relaxed in the bar and discussed the tactics for the gig the next day.

Kim went on stage at 10.30pm.

Laurent Voulzy introduced Kim and then later made a guest appearance, playing guitar on 'Chequered Love'. The concert was superb, and with an audience of 23,000 there was a terrific atmosphere. I recognised a few of you in the audience but unfortunately we did not get the chance to meet up. I hope that one day we will have the opportunity.

We didn't return to the hotel until 1.00am but the evening was not over yet!! Everyone gathered around the piano in the bar, and we had lots of fun singing everyone's favourite songs. Kim and Laurent sang some beautiful songs, and it seemed a real shame to end all the fun, but by 5.30am everyone was ready to call it a day!!

The coach was due to leave the hotel at midday on Sunday and I felt reluctant to leave so soon. Nevertheless the journey back gave me an ideal chance to catch up on some sleep. At 8.30pm we arrived in London from where Roy and I caught the train home.

All in all we had a very successful and enjoyable weekend and because so many of us were able to go along it made it that extra bit special.






