

Hallo everyone,

I hope you are all keeping well. As you will all be aware by now the new album has been released. I personally felt there could have been a wider choice of MK tacks on the Album as the RAK tracks have already featured on several 'Seat Off L.P.s., both here in England and on the Continent. Songs such as Can't Get Enough (Of Your Love) and Schoolgiri definitely deserved to be included on the Album. Also tracks such as Say You Really Yeart Me, Beart Over Hind, Rey Hister Reartache and It's Bere (which have not been included on the Album Latiend higher chart positions that Child Come Mays. I was very disappointed to find that none of the tracks off of Orw Kroves had been included. What do you think? Incidentally, in France the CD of the Album has also been released as a limited edition which includes a one track CD single of Cad't Get Enough (Of Your Love).

MCA have assured me that another single is scheduled. Until quite recently MCA were toying with the idea of releasing a remix of Rids In America, but they have now returned to their original choice of In My Life (which was originally scheduled for release in August!) and a video for this has recently been filmed. This is now scheduled for release at the end of October although, as we all know, plans change; so keep your ear to the qround for further new.

I hope you all saw the article about Kim in September's Record Collector. In case you were wondering if Fete Marchant is a relative of mine, it is in fact me. They got my mane wrong! I would like to point out that I only advised on the value of certain records and did not compile the discography, which was incorrect. I have written to Record Collector pointing out the errors and hopefully they will publish my letter.

Thank you wery much to everybody who sent back their questionnaires. What about the rest of you? Remember that this Fanzise is for the fans by the fans and I need as much input from all of you as possible, and this includes letting me know what you thought of my first effort, so please, if you haven't returned your questionnaire, please do so as soon as possible. Togofilly in the next issue I will be able to give you a full run down on what you liked, what you want to see in future issues, what your favourite records are, etc.

I really appreciate all your letters, but I would also appreciate an SAE\IRC as it is very expensive for me to keep replying to all of you.

KIM WILDE

When Kim Wilde's 'Kids In America' went top twenty in February 1981 she lined up in that week's chart alougside some of the big names of the day: Adam & The Amits, Ultravor, The Stray Cats, Toyah, Rainhow, Shaky, Madness. It was her first single, she was an overnight success and there were those who harboured suspicions that her career might prove to be as long and illustrious as that of Joe Bolce, perpetrator of that month's number one, 'Shaddopa Tour Face'.

But Kim has outlived them all. Twelve years on she's releasing her minth album and her Zôth single, with sales of over 6 million albums and 11 million singles under her belt and countless gold and platinum discs lining her walls. The overnight sensation of 1981 is now the most successful British female solo artist of all time.

Kin became a pop star pretty much by accident. The Wilde family has been in the music business for over 30 years. She grew up steeped in pop music and gained valuable studio experience in her teens singling on various sessions including those of her father Marty. After leaving Art College in 1980 her ambition was to work as a session singer. She figured there'd be more variety, and more actual singing. During her session singing she was spotted by Mickie Most who felt she had the looks of a star.

Ber brother Ricky was demoing tracks, so it was a natural progression for his to produce Kim. The first fruit of this recording was "Kids in America" virties to Marty and Ricky and Mickie Most loved it. So did everyone else! The single reached no 2 in the charts and captured the imagination of many millions of people throughout the world - both musically and in terms of the fresh young image which Kim portrayed. Many young girls would try to look like Kim - a great compliment. It was easy to relate to her and emulate her svijish simplicity, primarily bease most of her clothes came from Orfam shops and were therefore within the average cirl's spending capacity.

"It all happened very quickly and I didn't really have time to get really excited about it all' remembers Kim. "After Kids there was pressure to get another single done, get the Album recorded and do lots of promotion all over the place. It never stopped, and it's never stopped really. But those first few years were some of the most fun I've ever had. I seemed to live on the road to and from Beathrow gold to all these really wacky pop shows in Germany and would always be with the same people - the Police, Tempole Tudor, Sister Sledge. I'd hang around with Kirsty MacColl a to the cause we were both dation people out of Pempole Tudor and we would have such

a laugh. You'd get all these pop stars staying in the same hotel for two days causing absolute maybem, ridiculous rock 'n' roll behaviour. I wasn't really one of the lads but I did my fair share."

Any worries about Kin's staying power were banished by the top 20 success of a succession of singles - Chequered Love, Nater on Glass, Cabaddia, View from a Bridge, Love Blonde - and her three RAK albuns, Kin Wilde, Select and Catch as Catch Can. Two extensive European Tours established Kin as a strong concert attraction throughout Europe. The crowning glory for this first phase of Kin's career came in 1983 when she won a BPI award for best female vocalist, which represented an acceptance by her peers.



In 1984 Kim signed a worldwide deal with MCA records. Her first LF for the new label, Teases and Dares, spawned the hit singles The Second Time and Rage to Love, and 1986's Another Step included You Keep We Bangin' On, a number one in Canada, Amstralia and the US and a top five hit all over the world, along with the title track, a deet with Junior and the first of Kim's own compositions to be released as a single.

One possible admirer of Kim's reworking of the Supreme's favourite could have been Hichael Jackson and perhaps this along with Kim's growing reputation and popularity after two more successful European Tours in 1985 and 1986, that won her the support slot om Hichael Jackson's 34 date European tour in the summer of 1988.

Her sixth L.P. Close, released that year yielded another five consecutive top forty singles: Hey Mister Heartache, You Came, Never Trust A Stranger, Four Letter Word and Love In The Natural Way.

In 1990, following the release of the seventh album, Love Moves, Kim supported David Bowie in a string of European stadium dates.

'the Michael Jackson and David Bowie tours were a great challenge for me and at first I wondered if it was beyond me to play in front of such enormous crowds. It had to learn a lot of things very quickly - about working the crowd, about working my voice, about pacing. But in the end it all turned out to be amazing. We were doing basically a greatest hits package. It went down really well. The songs still sound really good, even the very early ones. There is so much pretentions, self conscious, pompous pop music around, fa an actually really proud to get out there and sins goons like Chequered love, just simple fur enjoyable pop music.

I think people have a healthier attitude these days towards shamelessly enjoying pop music. When I started at the beginning of the 80's punk music still had a hold and there were all the style victims around, painfully desperate to be cool.

Nowadays there seems to be a lot of bands saying 'we don't want to be hip and trendy, we just want to make great pop records'. That's my attitude. It's what I've always done and what I'll always do in the future.

A hit record is simply in the grooves - that's why people go out and buy it. You can forget the statements, forget what's hip and trendy and substitute it for what matters: a brilliant melody with good lyrics. Good pop music is where it's at, always has been, always will be."

off to keep you a fair distance from the performers. There was only a handful of people there so I joined them at the railings. After about 45 minutes to 1 hour Kim came out of one of the trailers. She was about 50 feet away. I waved to her and called her name. At first she waved back and held her hand up to shade the sun from her eyes. I was wearing the "Love Is' Fan Club t-shirt. I don't know if she saw it or not but she came right over and said hallo. I started to take photographs as soon as I had seen her appear. I asked her if she would sign something for me and the first thing that came to hand was the 1992 Fan Club magazine. She gave me a nice smile and asked me what my name was. She then signed the magazine 4 John love Kim Wilde. At this point

I don't normally listen to Radio One preferring the local Metro FM station but I tuned in to Radio One on 11th July to see where If I Can't Have You was in the charts. After the song was played the DJ said that Kim Wilde was appearing on the Radio One Road Show the next day in Irvine Scotland. I looked at my road atlas and calculated Irvine to be about 100-120 miles from where I live in South Shields (it turned out to be nearer 200 miles!). I still hadn't decided whether I was to go or not. The next morning when I awoke at 6.15 am it was a nice sunny morning. I decided instantly to go and see Kim. Walked around looking for a good vantage point. was then that I noticed you could walk around the rear of the stage area - although it was railed



I gave ay camera to someone else and placed my arm around Kim. Kim said it was nice to have met me and posed for some more photos. Kim them went back into her trailer until it was time for her to go on stage. I them went around to the front area. Kim was given a great reception and she started with "If I Can' Eave You'. She then said a few words to the crowd and them went into "You Came". When she finished her spot she went back to her trailer. Later on after Jason Donovan had been on, Kim came out and went up onto the roof of the roadshow to watch the RAF display team. After signing some more autographs Kim was driven away through a waving cheering crowd.

Tyne Tees T V Studio 17th July 1993

I met Kim again at Tyme Tees TV Studios where she was appearing in Gime 5. I again received her autograph and took some great photos. I also gave her two enlargement photos including the one of the two of us together and a letter to say how nice it was to have met her in Irvine. Again she was very nice towards me. The photos are very exclusive as I was the only person at the main entrance.


